It is a tremendous honor to lead this esteemed organization and I would like to thank the membership for placing your trust in me.

Our organization is at a crossroads. We saw M-OCDS membership dip below 50% market share in the past year, which was very troubling for me as it was the first time that's happened. And though we quickly salvaged it from that threshold, my main objective this year must be Membership Retention and Recruitment, because without a healthy supply of members, our organization cannot carry out its mission.

How are we going to do this? In May, at the House of Delegates, ADA President-Elect Dr. Jeff Cole summarized the ADA strategy with a quote by Mark Twain, "Go out on a limb, because that's where the fruit is."

I believe that we need to try some new things to adapt to the changing landscape in this profession. I want to build on our successes and make them more relevant to the needs of new and experienced dentists alike.

First, our core interaction with our members happens at the monthly dinner meetings. We have a dynamite CE line-up with a few headliners this year (all without a dues increase!), and I hope that draws some new faces into the crowd.

Feel free to invite a non-member colleague to a meeting or check-in with your referring doctors who you haven't seen in a while to see where they've been. Find out what the barriers are to their attendance and share them with me. Retention of existing members is half of our battle.

Our social media presence has gone from non-existent to 91 followers on Facebook, about 20% of the active membership, not to mention our growing Instagram page. In closing, my job as President is to be accountable to each trustee, committee chair, and member-at-large to make sure that you have the resources that you need to carry out our mission. I look forward to a year of friendship and prosperity.

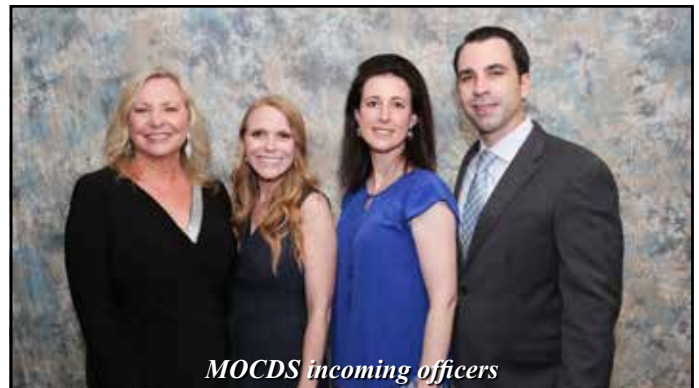

M-OCDS MEETING MINUTES

August 7, 2018 (Organizational Meeting)

Attendance: Doctors: R. Angowski, E. Boim, J. Feeney, M. Friedman, R. Hersh, Robert Isaacson, Richard Isaacson, J. Jeffries-Bruno, J. Kukucka, C. LaFalce, A. Seto, J. Soliman, T. Sniscak, E. Velazquez

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Sniscak at 7:00 p.m.

Approval of the minutes from last meeting:

Motion was proposed to approve the minutes from the last meeting, May 1, 2018. Dr. R. Isaacson first and Dr. R. Angowski second the motion.

President's Report (Dr. Sniscak):

First and foremost, thank you to the Board of Trustees for the vote of confidence to lead this esteemed organization for the 2018-19 year. It is an honor.

I am proud to report that we have 28 Trustees and I would like to recognize those starting their first full year term: Dr. Ariane Seto, Dr. John Solimon, and Dr. Daniel Winston. Thank you for sacrificing your time to serve as leaders in organized dentistry.

My primary objective this year is to reverse the membership trends that we have seen in the last few years. That means both membership recruitment and retention. Last year when we briefly dipped below 50% market share, alarm bells went off. Through the efforts of the Membership Committee lead by Dr. McTaggart, we are making a comeback. In our component, (as of August 1) 37 non-renews, 3rd quarter 2017- 47 total. These are officially non-members now. Five have joined at half year for 2018. Membership numbers(active) 450, 3rd quarter 2017-454

Let's continue to welcome new members, particularly our residents. Mentorship can be formal or informal. To enhance member engagement, this year we are going to debut a new event on our calendar. This Social Networking Event is open to all members, with the specific goal of welcoming anyone who joined the Society in the last year. Meeting existing members in a casual (and fun) atmosphere will hopefully build professional and personal bonds that I believe can be the tipping point when it comes to maintaining membership.

The event will take place at the Asbury Biergarten & Festhalle on Friday, September 21, 2018, from 5 to 8 p.m. I am hoping to bring in new faces by having this event on a weekend night and allowing members to bring a guest. Guests will be \$25; members less than one year will get to bring a guest for no charge (to encourage their attendance). A section of the rooftop deck has been reserved with our own waitstaff, bartender and food cart. It's the perfect place to spend an evening with friends or stop by for a cocktail on your way to dinner in Asbury with your

significant other.

The event is anticipated to cost between two and three thousand dollars depending on attendance. We negotiated a special rate from the Biergarten of \$19 pp plus a running bar tab. We have budgeted \$2000 and I have procured an additional \$1200 from Seth Arndt of Tomoro to be our exclusive sponsor. I felt having several sponsors would take away from the member-to-member interaction.

Marketing director of Biergarten is doing a postcard mailer for us at no charge. We will use this as the invite.

On that subject, Dr. Sones has been doing a tremendous job procuring sponsors over the last few years. This year he has had some regulars back out. We could use up to 5 more. Please have any interested vendors email him directly.

Since Dr. Sones' email went out we have received 3 more sponsors.

All Dinner Meeting CE credits have been approved by the State Board.

Update on November 9 Dinner Meeting: Dr. Viola will be speaking on opioids. NJDA also booked him for their Oct. 3 Resource Day. They didn't tell him the topic and advertised it without Dr. Viola's approval. Turns out it is the same topic as our Nov. dinner meeting. Dr. Sniscak does not feel it will be a conflict or detract from our dinner meeting attendance. We will work with the NJDA to promote both programs together. We feel it will be different audiences at each of the events. Ours is free to members. There is a fee to attend Resource Day.

And a housekeeping note: our board meeting room will likely change in the fall due to construction. We will make the new location abundantly clear via email.

Dr. Feeney wants to know our opinions on possible requirement to have a mandatory general practice residency in order to get a license. One problem: not enough positions.

Also, the hospital may potentially be liable as one of your educators if you are ever sued.

IF you are sued and you haven't done a GPR, attorney can then potentially ask you "Dr have you ever completed a residency"?

Council on Dental Benefits (Dr. Sirota):

We are looking for a new chairperson. Dr. Sirota would like to step down. As per Dr Kukucka it is a good council to be on. You learn a lot about insurance. The council corrects insurance problems. They get assembly men and women involved and explain to them how dental insurance works. Any member who has an insurance complaint can bring it up to the council and Joan Monaco will help you. This may be a good position for a newer trustee. Meetings are usually on Wed. mornings about 4 times a year. You also get to meet the employees at NJDA.

Council on Governmental & Public Affairs (Dr. Velasquez):

Dr Velazquez asked trustees how they would like her to proceed for the next BOT meeting at NJDA after the circulation of all the emails over the early part of the summer. Trustees decided that a survey of members may be useful of varying grievances to be used by Dr Monaco & the Council on Dental Benefits.

The council of Governmental & Public Affairs has been working on a few items. The Credentialing Bill passed the senate & is waiting for action in the Fall. The Lease Bill is out of both committees and we do have support and Delta on our side. Some insurance groups have mounted opposition. Jim, Joan & Art will be meeting in the Fall to address their concerns and continue to fight for this bill. If this goes thru, we may be FIRST in the nation. We have been approved for additional money (37K) for the SPA grant to be used for Governmental & Public Affairs. More information will be had when the summer is over.

NJ Dental Lifeline Network (formerly Donated Dental Services) (Dr. Feeney):

For the fiscal year July 1, 2017-Apr 30, 2018:

Money received \$36,772 of that \$34,440 are foundation grants and

\$2,232 are personal contributions.

No governmental support for this organization in our state as opposed to smaller, less active state DLN programs who enjoy large government monies.

Expenses: \$77,762 despite decrease in salaried hours of their administration.

244 patients have completed treatment resulting in a total value of \$569,114 which is an average of \$4,111 of donated services per patient.

Since inception in 1988 a total value of donated treatment is \$24,127,894 representing 8,959 NJ citizens.

Presently there are 601 NJ volunteer dentists involved plus 108 orthodontists.

M-OCDS has 73 of the 709.

Currently NJDLN is running in a projected \$40K deficit due to increase in administrative costs, a decrease in charitable/corporate support and a unique absence of governmental fiscal assistance. This resulted in national DLN supplementing \$34,736 for 2016-17. For 2017-18 an amount exceeding this is predicted. All the while the NJDLN has operated on a bare bones budget producing \$11 of dentistry for every \$1 spent administratively. This is not a long term business plan of operation. National is strained to continue the generous financing.

and can no longer fund the NJDLN. Therefore, each component will be asked to donate funds to help support the NJDLN and keep it viable. These donated funds will be used

for administrative costs to help anchor the organization and its future. It will cease to exist if needed funding isn't received.

Efforts are under way to petition the NJ governmental powers that be to request needed funding. Thank you Mr. James Schultz.

Course Description

Management of acute dental pain is accomplished through a clinical approach that successfully incorporates opioid and non-opioid analgesics. However, this normally occurs outside the dental office, away from our immediate supervision and we are often faced with the difficult task of managing patient pain while also avoiding adverse outcomes for both our patients and our communities. Thus, it is critical for clinicians to accurately identify the need for pain control, individualize patient care and assess the efficacy of the analgesic agents to be administered. This program will provide an overview of the effective management of acute dental pain. Using case scenarios, special emphasis will be given to appropriate utilization of opioid analgesics and their impact on the dental community.

Dr. Patricia Ahlert Fitzgerald, 83, a longtime Holmdel resident and owner of Bayshore Cosmetic Dentistry, passed away at home on May 23, 2018. She was born in the Bronx, NY to Charles R. and Theresa Ellen (Williams) Ahlert. Dr. Ahlert earned her Bachelor of Science degree from CCONY, Class of 1956 and went on to New York University Dental School where she was the valedictorian of the graduating Class of 1960. She also became the first certified woman cosmetic dentist in New Jersey in 1980. Dr. Ahlert enjoyed flying with her first husband, Pete, so in 1964 she added a single engine pilot license to her list of accomplishments. In addition, Dr. Ahlert was the NJ Women's Chess Champion in the in 1980's. Dr. Ahlert practiced dentistry in Holmdel from 1962-1995 and was a member of the NJDA & MOCDS. She was predeceased by her parents, her brothers, Joseph and Donald Ahlert, her first husband, Claude Peter Regan in 1979 and in 2009 by her second husband, Dr. Herbert Clark Fitzgerald. Dr. Ahlert is survived by her children; Dr. Timothy P. Regan and wife Colleen of Lincroft, Dr. Claudia J. Regan and husband Ivan Pinhas of Colts Neck.



Dr. Raymond J. Salani, 86, of Oakhurst, passed away at peace in the loving arms of his wife. He was born in 1932 in the Bronx to the late Guido and Nella (nee Raffaella) Salani. Raymond grew up in New York, where he met the love of his life at the age of 13. He was a brilliant man and graduated #1 in his class at CCONY and also #1 in his class when he graduated from dental school, all while raising his first two children. He was a member of the NJDA & MOCDS. Raymond had many hobbies, he was Mr. Fix it, he loved to work on cars and around the house, building his own 20x40 swimming pool, and even after retirement, never sat around idle. Raymond went back to school upon retirement and received his Mortgage Broker's license. He was a parishioner at St. Leo's in Lincroft for 40 years while residing there. Raymond was a father figure to more people than just his children, he served as a little league coach for many years. Most of all, Raymond loved his family.

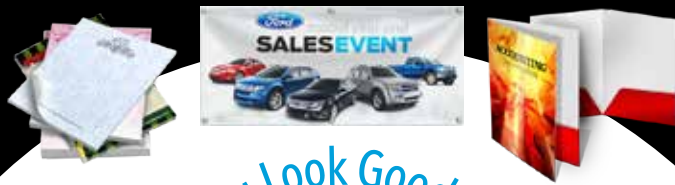

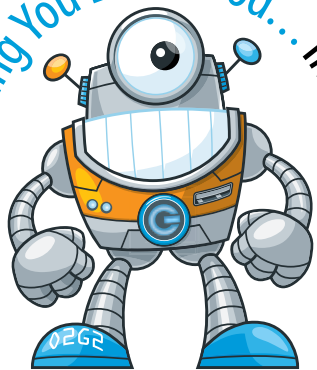

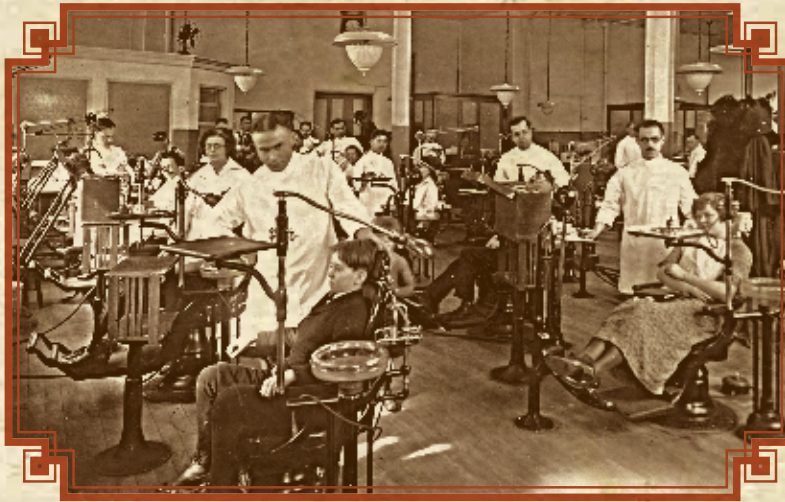
