NEW STATE AND FEDERAL REGULATIONS IN EFFECT JULY 18, 2016



July 29, 2016

Below is a summary of NJ State Board of Dentistry regulations that went into effect on July 18, 2016. Additionally, the United States Office for Civil Rights has released a new non-discrimination posting requirement. STATE BOARD REQUIRES WRITTEN EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

Effective July 18, 2016, the New Jersey State Board of Dentistry adopted a regulation that requires each dental office, facility, dental clinic or institution at which there is patient contact to: "1. Have a written protocol for managing medical or dental emergencies; 2. Have equipment to maintain adult and pediatric airways; 3. Have an ambu bag (bag-valve-mask resuscitator); and 4. Ensure that all staff are trained upon hire, and at least annually thereafter, to implement the emergency protocol."

STATE BOARD ADOPTS REGULATION GOVERNING GENERAL SUPERVISION OF DENTAL HYGIENISTS

In the same notice that imposed "emergency protocols," the State Board adopted a regulation (1) expanding and clarifying the procedures that can be performed by dental hygienists under direct supervision and (2) governing the scope of practice of licensed dental hygienists under general supervision. HHS REQUIRES COVERED ENTITIES TO POST NOTICE OF CONSUMER CIVIL RIGHTS

In a regulation which became effective July 18, 2016, the United States Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS") required all "covered entities," including doctors who accept Medicaid, to post a notice of consumer civil rights.

Also, it requires covered entities with 15 or more employees to adopt a civil rights grievance procedure and to designate an employee to coordinate its compliance efforts.

Further, covered entities must post information telling consumers with disabilities and consumers with limited English proficiency about the right to receive communication assistance, and to post taglines in at least the top 15 non-English languages spoken in the State in which the entity is located or does business, advising consumers of the availability of free language assistance services. The regulation applies to every health program or activity that receives HHS funding, every health program or activity administered by HHS and every health program or activity administered by an entity created by Title 1 of the Affordable Care Act.

TWO FEDERAL POSTER REVISIONS EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1ST

The US Department of Labor has announced 2 revisions to their posters. Please be sure that you post these versions of the posters: Employee polygraph notice 8-1-2016 (<http://www.njda.org/docs/librariesprovider35/private-library-new-jersey/employee-polygraph-notice-8-1-2016.pdf?sfvrsn=2>) and the Fair Labor Standards Act Aug. 1, 2016. (<http://www.njda.org/docs/librariesprovider35/default-document-library/minwage.pdf?sfvrsn=2>) The new posters are mandatory as of August 1, 2016.

The EPPA notice has very minor revisions, but the new FLSA poster has substantive changes. It advises that nursing mothers must be provided reasonable break time to express breast milk and a private place to do so, other than a bathroom. The new poster also includes additional information about FLSA enforcement, and the misclassification of employees as independent contractors.

Dr. John Feeney Receives Award

Dr. John Feeney, of Wall Township, retired Oral Maxillofacial Surgeon and founding partner of Coastal Oral Surgery in Sea Girt, Brick Town and Toms River, received The Presidential Life Time Achievement Award for distinguished service from The New Jersey Dental Association (NJDA) on June 4, 2016.

The award is a presidential appointment after evaluating nominations from the thirteen component societies of the N.J.D.A. state's 5,275 members.

N.J.D.A. is a tripartite extension of the American Dental Association (ADA.) and the Monmouth Ocean County Dental Society (MOCDS).

The award represents a professional worthiness at the highest level of dedication and long standing commitment to the A.D.A., N.J.D.A. and M.O.C.D.S. affiliations.

Dr. Feeney was selected upon considering:

- a. His presidential administration and trustee status of the Monmouth Ocean County Dental Society, The New Jersey Society of Oral Maxillofacial Surgery, The New Jersey Foundation of Dentistry for the Disabled and The New Jersey Dental Society of Anesthesia.
- b. His National and State Presidential awards for community service from the American Association of Oral Maxillofacial Surgeons (2000) and the New Jersey Dental Association (2004) respectively.
- c. His fellowship in The International and the American College of Dentists and The American Association of Oral Maxillofacial Surgeons.
- d. His emeritus attending level at Community Medical Center, Toms River, Monmouth Medical Center, Long Branch and Jersey Shore University Medical Center Neptune where he was director of Oral Maxillofacial Surgery for an unprecedented 25 years.
- e. His provider and administrative contributions to the New Jersey Donated Dental Service Program that has become a national leader in number of Doctors volunteering who provide over 23 million dollars worth of donated treatment to the most vulnerable citizens of New Jersey. President G.W. Bush acknowledged these efforts with a citation stating "volunteerism is the future of America".
- f. His nomination to Gov. Chris Christie for appointment to the State Board Divisions of Consumer Affairs within The Attorney Generals Office.

Dr. Feeney was therefore recognized for his four decades of unique contributions via community service, volunteerism and leadership roles within the profession.

In response to his Lifetime Achievement Award he most recently has received a congratulatory certificate from The Congress of the United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C. It was signed by Rep. Christopher Smith dean of the NJ delegation who acknowledged Dr. Feeneys dedication, social conscience and diligence. He was also issued a Proclamation of Joint Legislative Resolution from the NJ Senate and General Assembly, Trenton. signed by Senate President Stephen Sweeney, Speaker Vincent Prieto, Senator Robert Signer, "Assemblyman Sean Kean and Assemblyman David Rible.

Dr. Feeney's acceptance remarks

John F Kennedy who often paraphrased Oscar Wilde said it best!
"From those to whom much is given much is expected. It is not ourselves but our responsibilities we must take serious."

Upon considering the ubiquitous challenges to strive for excellence within our chosen pathway, as we maintain current competence and accept our social responsibilities, we must never disregard the privilege that is the sacred trust
