The Division of Consumer Affairs is warning all licensed professionals about individuals impersonating New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs (DCA) investigators, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) agents, DEA investigators, New Jersey Drug Control Unit Investigators, federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Investigators, and other law enforcement personnel, as part of an extortion scheme.

The Impersonators are contacting licensees by telephone, stating that they are subject of an Investigation. The callers are demanding money to clear up the matter, or threatening to revoke the individuals license. Please be advised that the Division of Consumer Affairs will not contact licensees by telephone to discuss investigations or demand money.

Anyone receiving a telephone call from a person purporting to be any of the above mentioned individuals seeking money, should refuse the demand. We encourage you to report the call to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at FTCComplaintAssistant.gov. You may also report the call to the Division at Ask Consumer Affairs.

 A letter was submitted to the NJ State Board of Dentistry on behalf of the Monmouth Ocean County Dental Society in response to the BOD proposed rule changes. The letter was received by the state board on January 14th, 2020.

Vice President's Report (Dr. Guerrasio):

I have worked with the accountant and the executive board on the proposed budget for 2020-2021. We need to look at our expenses and determine which expenses we can cut or reduce to make sure we have a balanced budget. The cost of our dinner meeting has increased because we have had great attendance. It has also become increasingly more difficult to obtain commitments from our sponsors to help subsidize the cost of the dinner meetings.

After reviewing the proposed budget for 2020-2021 and having much discussion, a motion was made my D. Shah: "I move to discontinue print copies of our newsletters and provide our newsletters electronically." The motion was 2nd by E. Boim and was discussed in great length. The concern of continuing to print the newsletter was the cost of the printing itself and the postage. It was discussed as to whether we want to completely cut out the newsletter or only print biannually.

E. Velazquez made a motion to amend D. Shah's motion to "print and distribute hard copies of our newsletter biannually instead of quarterly." The motion was 2nd by Richard Isaacson and was discussed in detail.

T. Sniscak motioned to table the amended motion until our next Trustee meeting in order to do research on cost and whether or not our newsletter sponsors would still be interested in print sponsorships via electronic distribution. E. Velazquez 2nd. A call to vote was made and the motion passed.

Richard Isaacson motioned to table the D. Shah's original motion until our next Trustee meeting and was 2nd by E. Velazquez and a call to vote was made and the motion passed.

Treasurer's Report (Dr. LaFalce):

All accounts are in good standing.

Secretary's Report (Dr. Sones):

The NJDA has officially asked for nominations for Trustee, Alternate Trustee, ADA Delegate and ADA Alternate Delegate as well as nominations for our component to be represented in the State Association councils. We must complete the nominations this evening as NJDA has requested we submit everything by March 5, 2020.

NJDA Trustee Report (Dr. Velazquez):

1/15/2020 - This was the official RIBBON CUTTING for the newly renovated headquarters. There was a great turnout and our previous Speaker Dr. Chinoy joined in the ribbon cutting in his wheelchair and was able to access the now handicapped accessible building. We had guests that addressed the board: Dr. Chad Gehani (president of ADA), Dr. Darwin Hayes (the dental director of NJ), and Dr. Ceil Feldman (dean of RSDM).

Council of Nominations: Dr. Rossi. The following is the slate of officers for the administrative year 2020-2021. President-Elect, Luciano Ghisalberti; Vice-President, Peter DeSciscio; Treasurer, Renee Arace; Secretary, Elisa Velazquez; and Edward Tirpack, Speaker of the House. According to the Bylaws, candidates can be nominated by personal petition up to 90 days before the annual House of Delegates meeting. Anyone wishing to become a candidate should inform the NJDA Executive Director. The deadline date for nominations by personal petition or by component society is March 5, 2020.

Membership: Dr. Brett Handsman reported that membership has increased with active licensed dentists and total numbers. Great work NJDA!

Council on Governmental & Public Affairs - Dr. Elisa Velazquez reported on the 2019 elections. District 1 flipped from Blue to Red and there were other tight races. She pointed out that our member, Dr. Jeffrey Van Drew, switched from Democrat to Republican. The Republicans held a lot of key elections and the new legislature began yesterday. The bills that were not passed must be reintroduced in the new legislature. The SPA Grant has been again approved. \$42,000 has been earmarked for Government & Public Affairs. The \$250,000 bill toward staffing the special care treatment center at RSDM was vetoed by the governor, claiming proper channels were not followed. The retreat is next week for PAC and Council on Governmental & Public Affairs on Wednesday at Old York Country Club. The Councils next meeting is scheduled for February 12th at 1:00 pm at NJDA headquarters.

Art Meisel - Everyone had until 1/18/20 (60 days after being public) to make comments for proposed State Board regulations. Each item proposed was discussed one by one. NJDA will send a formal letter before the deadline. MOCDS and NJAPD were commended for getting a letter in to voice concerns of the members they represent.

Presidents Report - GKAS 2/7/20. He met with Dr. Hayes to outline goals for oral health for our state.

VP REPORT - Dr. Weiner discussed AMT and our ongoing relationship. Members are signing up with little attrition and members seem pleased.

TREASURER REPORT: Dr. Peter DeSciscio - 2019 ended with receiving \$1,672,432 in dues and by December 31st we had already receive \$487,773 in 2020 dues. Renovation expenses were approximately \$572,000 including furniture, AV & kitchen appliances.

The Capital Campaign pledges are just over \$452,000 with approximately \$125,000 already received and used toward the project. We will receive more than \$325,000 over the next 3-4 years. Please consider a pledge. NEW BUSINESS: Dues for Active Life Members. The ADA passed a resolution stating that Active Life members will pay full dues, however Connecticut and New York are not going to follow the ADA on this. There were comments on the pros and cons of following the ADA or staying with the 75%. This was tabled to allow components to discuss.

#### NEXT MEETING: 3/18/20

Motion was made by D. Shah to direct Dr. Velazquez, as our NJDA trustee, to vote to keep our NJDA dues structure the same as it is now in regard to active life members and not change to correlate with the proposed dues changes to be implemented by the ADA. Motion was 2nd by S. Albin. Discussion ensued. A call to vote was made and the vote passed unanimously.

#### 2019 EOY Report:

- Active licensed total-3585 an increase of 107 from 2018
- Total year-end number was 4,621 and increase of 145 from 2018
- Market share 51.9% up from 51.3%

• Women increased by 82, Specialists by 13 & New Dentists by 138 2020 Report: Total of 3123 have paid to date, 68% have renewed.

SPI Recruitment: Strategic Promotional Incentive (SPI) which allows nonmembers to join for half off for the entire year. The year's focus is on specialists and large group practices. To date the NJDA has sent a mailer and 3 emails. They will continue to recruit these non-members. ADA sent a mailer several weeks ago and will once again begin their calling program.

2021 Dues: As a reminder, resolution 15 was passed at the 2019 ADA House of Delegates and will go into effect in 2021, this will not impact this year's (2020) dues. The changes to the national dues structure that will be implemented for the 2021 dues cycle are as follows:

• Elimination of the \$30 graduate dues to \$0

• Elimination of the 25% discount for life members to make that a full dues paying category. The last year of life membership discounts will be 2020 and current life members will not be grandfathered in under the new dues structure.

• Elimination of two discounts for new graduates. Rate A (1st year out of dental school) will remain \$0; Rate B (2nd year out of dental school) will change to 50% of full dues. Rates C (3rd year out of dental school) and D (4th year out of dental school) will be eliminated.

The Council discussed the anticipated negative effect it may have on those segments of members and our overall membership numbers. Revenue may be unaffected even if we lose some members because of the dues increase. The Council is not in favor of this, even if the effect on revenue is ok. The Council does understand that these changes were voted on and passed by the ADA House of Delegates who are member dentists, not staff.

NJDA will discuss 2021 constituent dues in the next several months. 2019 ADA EOY Report:

• The ADA ended 2019 with an active licensed dentist membership of 129,547, an increase of 539 over the total 129,008 in 2018.

• The total market of active licensed dentists in 2019 was 207,706, an increase of 2,657 over the total of 205,049 in 2018.

• The ADA ended 2019 with a market share of 62.4% down from 62.9% in 2018 as a result of the considerable increase in the total market.

• The number of active licensed members increased in several target markets in 2019:

- Women increased by 2,139 0
- Foreign trained increased by 593 0
- General Practitioners by 669 0

The actual account-ing values the accountant provided I believe are higher because other printing & mailing expenses were allocated to "Newsletter Expenses." Regardless of this, I have always maintained that as long as advertising income was high, it didn't matter. However, we are down to 5 advertis-ers for an annual income of \$2,580. When I let Doug, owner of Omega Graphics, know our situation he offered several options to continue print ers for an annual income of \$2,580. When I let Doug, owner of Omega Graphics, know our situation, he offered several options to continue print-ing the newsletter. He would reduce his fee by \$250/issue, or \$370 if we reduce the issue from 12 to 8 pages. There would also be a reduc-tion if we eliminate all color from the printing (color would remain in the digital PDF version). If we choose to go digital for any issue, the cost would be \$300 which is for creative only. We could produce a digital 12-page version 5 times each year for a total of \$1,500, a total savings of \$7,100. I don't believe that our advertisers care if we stop printing so if they all stay we would net \$1,080, or we could lose two and be covered for the expense.

Treasurer's Report (Dr. Sones):

ADA Delegate (Dr. Hersh):

On June 25, 2020, Dr. Gehani, president of the ADA, announced that the ADA Board of Trustees had decided to conduct the ADA House of Delegates' meeting virtually in October, 2020 instead of in Florida. This decision was made, Dr. Gehani explained," in an effort to insure the saf-est environment for all ADA delegates."

On July 26, 2020, Dr. George Shepley, Fourth District Trustee, reported that the overwhelming sentiment of the ADA Fourth District trustees was to conduct the Fourth District Caucus virtually, as well. The meeting is scheduled for September 26, 2020, during which time nominations for the office of Fourth District Trustee will take place. According to the Fourth District Rules of Procedure and the ADA Constitution and By-laws, only delegates can nominate or participate in the voting process for the delegates.

#### COUNCILS:

Council on Annual Session (Dr. Andricsak): Due to the COVID-19 pandemic many changes to our upcoming celebra-tory events are necessary. Discussions were as follows:

NDA Dinner Dance: The event has been rescheduled to April 25, 2021. NDA Family Picnic: Currently scheduled for Sunday September 13th at 12:00pm at Mercer County Park. Questions were raised about turnout at an outdoor event with the Covid-19 situation as it stands. A survey will be sent to the general membership to determine interest. Based on survey results, the Picnic will move forward or be cancelled

NDA Anniversary Celebration: Currently scheduled for Sunday October 25th, Current restrictions would severely limit this event. The Council has decided that it will now be held mostly virtually similar in fashion to the Installation of Officers.

The future of the Annual Session was discussed.

Future plans are currently uncertain, but different ideas were discussed and details will be determined at a future time.

Future meeting dates are to be determined.

Council on Dental Benefits (Dr. Safari): Beam Dental – Fax received by a member dentist indicating that Dental Benefits Providers, Inc, a UnitedHealthcare Company, has entered a net-work arrangement with Beam Dental. As such, the dentist is automatically enrolled as a participating provider. Because of the non-leasing of net-work legislation passed in New Jersey the dentist was able to successfully refuse participation (or to "opt-out" of participation). Any member who received the fax from Dental Benefits Providers and wants to "opt-out" is urged to call the 800 number on the fax and express their desire to do so. Code D1999 for PPE – United Concordia is reimbursing for this code. Principal is reimbursing as well. Delta of New Jersey and Connecticut are running their own program for reimbursing where the dentist needs to running their own program for reimbursing where the dentist needs to be enrolled in EFT, and these participating Deltas are tabulating patient visits so no separate code is needed. Reimbursement will be paid monthly based on these tabulations.

The question came up about "non-covered services" and whether a den-tist can charge the patient if the benefit provider denies the coverage for PPE. It was advised that in the event the dentist is "non-par" and the plan is an insured plan, that the dentist advise the patient in advance that there will be a charge for the PPE. If the dentist is a participating provider it will depend on the position the plan takes.

The NDA is very aware of this issue and is actively looking to do some-thing legislatively, or through the Dept of Banking and Insurance, or both. Dr. Whitman reported that he spoke with someone regarding covering PPE for Medicaid and that it was not being covered and was "under dis-cussion". Dr. Whitman asked Mr. Meisel to look into this at the state level.

The question was raised whether all patients, insured and non-insured, should be charged for PPE. The conclusion was that all patients should be treated equally and charged accordingly. It was pointed out that all procedures do not necessarily require the additional PPE and thus do not need to be charged.

Benefit providers have indicated that these programs will be available for a limited amount of time.

Replacing Dr. Monaco – Ad will run soon to replace her. The Association certainly has a need for a Dental Benefits advocate. The candidate does not need to be a dentist.

Dr. Whitman-Number of patients covered by New Jersey Family Care (Medicaid) will rise. There will likely be fewer providers available due to the pandemic and the necessary PPE and protocols. The way a dental practice does business with Medicaid is by volume, and with the de-mands placed on properly treating patients during the pandemic, a den-tist cannot do the volume of work necessary to be profitable. In addition, the managed care companies have not stepped forward with advanced

the managed care companies have not stepped forward with advanced payments based on past income to help defray current overhead. It would also be better if those companies would step forward and cover PPE without dentists having to beg for it. Regarding Dental Networks and participation – Now more than ever it is important for all dentists to evaluate the programs with which they are participating and to decide if it is profitable for them to continue partici-pation. Dental corriers networks to sell their product (dental in option). participating and to decide if it is profitable for them to continue partici-pation. Dental carriers need their networks to sell their product (dental in-surance). If the network goes away, they have no product to sell. Carriers have been collecting premiums during this downtime. It would be nice if some of that money found its way to the providers. It is now a particularly good time for all dentists to evaluate their business models. Antoinette Tauk, DDS will take over as the new Chair for the Council on Dental Benefits after the Board Of Trustees meeting on June 3. Art Meisel reported that he will be filing a brief with the appellate division regarding the Smile Direct Club litigation. He also reported that Smile Direct Club recently filed a lawsuit against NBC seeking 2.85 billion dol-lars in damages from a report aired a few months ago.

Direct Club recently filed a lawsuit against NBC seeking 2.85 billion dol-lars in damages from a report aired a few months ago. Invited guest: Dr. Joan Monaco joined the meeting later. She discussed what is going on at Horizon. They are going to allow additional money for the D1999 code. For now, the code will be denied but should be covered on appeal. The reimbursement should be in the range of \$10 - \$15 per patient visit to cover the cost of PPE. Horizon will also offer a "prepayment loan". They will average a practice's 2019 claims submis-sions and loan 50% of the monthly average for 2 installments represent-ing 2 months. This loan will be interest free. Dates for the loan will be claims that are submitted at that time. This will be offered on the Medicaid side as well.

side as well. The question was asked about Horizon embedding dental coverage in their medical plans. Because of that it becomes necessary for the provider to submit to the medical plan first and then to submit the EOB from the medical to the dental for reimbursement. Dr. Monaco explained that part of her job now is to investigate a way that the 2 entities, medical and

dental, can share the data and reimburse quicker. Right now, the data flows to the medical where it is processed electronically. Changes to this system may take until some time in 2021 to happen. Dr. Monaço recommends that all dentists investigate EFT for their offices.

She sees this as the future of insurance payments. Dr. Monaco reported that the CDT Committee has been meeting and are

almost finished with the 2021 codes. She expects there will be a code for PPE, and likely not D1999.

The Council thanked Dr. Monaco for her tireless and dedicated service to

NIDA and to the profession of dentistry. Everyone wished Dr. Monaco well in her new position at Horizon. The Council thanked Dr. Ed Tirpack for his time as Chairman of the Council. Council on Membership (Dr. McTaggart):

A total of 3972 have paid to date, 86% have renewed. M-MOCDS has about 78 non-renews.

ADA Report: Bridget Baxter reported on the Peer 2 Peer toolkit, this in-formation has been forwarded to the Council. If anyone would like to see discussion points when conversing with non-members or non-renewed members please let me know.
