

Meeting was held via Zoom Video conference and was called to Order by ${\rm Dr}\,{\rm C}\,{\rm LaFalce}$ at 7:00 pm

Motion to approve minutes from previous trustees meeting May 4 2021 was raised by Dr R Isaacson; second by Dr J Soliman. A call to vote was made and the minutes were approved

Agenda was read as follows:

President's Report (Dr LaFalce):

I hope everyone is having a great summer.

Just when we thought we were at the tail end of dealing with COVID, it seems new mandates are on the horizon and, as always we will keep our members abreast of any developments.

We have, as a society done our best to keep everyone informed. Much of that is because of the excellent leadership last year by Dr Sally Guerrasio and I'd like to sincerely thank her for her service and guidance.

Everyone should have received your flip calendars in the mail.

I am excited about the speaker line up for the upcoming year and looking forward to once again meeting in person at the Waterview Pavilion.

I will be contributing to NJDA's Monday Morning Blasts with our component block on the bottom. The EB has decided that weekly is excessive. I will put info into the block approximately every 2 weeks. If anyone has any topics or information they want listed here please let me know.

We have updated our society mailing address with the CPA, on the website, and with the NJDA. Since we no longer have an Executive Secretary, we are using Dr Matt Sones' Toms River office address.

We have a new dinner meeting committee this year. Thank you to Drs Seto, Akriti Gupta and Sieg for volunteering!

Dr. Murphy Sieg will be joining the social media task force and will be keeping our online presence going. We are open to suggestions for the content everyone would like to see posted on social media.

We need to discuss options for location of our upcoming trustee meetings. Jersey Shore is still not allowing gatherings in their conference rooms so we are not allowed to reserve them at this time.

Regarding our general checking and savings accounts at Wells Fargo Bank: it has become increasingly difficult to add new treasurer to account and to use the debit card. We do not have the PIN and we are not able to retrieve it. The EB feels it would benefit us to switch to another bank such as TD. I will defer to Dr Soliman our treasurer to lead this discussion.

Vice President's Report (Dr. M Sones):

We are very much looking forward to a fantastic year. The nominations committee will likely be meeting in October to plan ahead for next year. We will need to confirm the current term lengths of the NJDA Trustee, the ADA delegates and alternates as those positions have a 5-year term limit. I will be starting to plan next year's calendar and line up speakers. I am going to try and keep in mind the new state board requirements as set forth by the state board so our members can get required CE at our dinner meetings. I am hoping our attendance may also increase at those meetings with everyone needing specific CE.

NJDA Trustee Report (Dr. M Furlong):

The NJDA House of Delegates meeting was in June. ADA President Daniel Klemmedson discussed how the White House will be focusing on OSHA and HIPPA, and how we are working to avoid excessive regulatory burden in our profession. We need to develop relationships with the new Health and Human Services Department. Advocacy is critical.

Ed Shepley is running for President Elect of the ADA. He and Mark Vitale are promoting "Give Veterans a Smile" to cover the large percentage of Vets who don't have coverage.

The new NJDA officers were installed: President Luciano Ghisalberti, President Elect Peter DiSciscio, VP Renee Arace, Treasurer Elisa Velazquez, Secretary Amit Vora, Speaker Ed Turpak, and Editor Harvey Nisselson.

Mark Vitale discussed NJDPAC items on the forefront: Bill to remove branch licenses, argument against the Dental Therapist Bill, engagement of more NJDA members/ underrepresented groups (holding special women's events), and a reminder that leaders should be Club Level contributors in NJDPAC.

Giorgio DiVencenzo discussed ADPAC is separate from NJDPAC with separate fund raising. NJ is the weakest ADPAC contributor within the 4th district and we should increase our donations.

Mitchell Weiner (outgoing NJDA President) presented the Presidential Service Award to Tom Rossi and Mark Vitale. The Sy Semanski Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to Maxine Feinberg.

The next NJDA Board of Trustees meeting will be Wed 8/18, reorganization meeting.

The next NJDA House of Delegates meeting will be Wed 11/17 at the Edison Sheraton.

ADA delegates meeting is from October 14-16. Raymond Cohlmia, DDS will be our new executive director from 10/1/21. He earned his dental degree in 1988 from OU. He was in private practice for 26 years, has served OU since 2009 as a faculty to reaching Dean's position in 2015 with various leadership positions during those years. He has been active leader at local, state and national levels including serving as a trustee to ADA 2015-2019, also served on many councils and committed at ADA-New dentist and council on membership, council on education, annual sessions, dental benefits, ADA political action committee.

Some of the hot topics ADA is actively monitoring, participating in at this time: Medicare to expand dental, vision and hearing coverage under Biden administration

Medicaid coverage for foster kids dental to increase from 21 to 25.

Treatment related to Congenital anomalies should be covered by insurance and Medicare.

Provider relief fund reporting guidelines and webinar.

Both Fidelity and Vanguard informed me that the corporate accounts are old and must be restated.

This was very complicated several years ago and it looks like it will be the same this time.

Good and welfare (Dr R McTaggart):

New Business:

1. Eblasts that will be done for MOCDS members:

Discussion NJDA member alert that Executive Order mandating that staff be vaccinated or subject to weekly Covid testing does not apply to dental offices

- 3. Discussed in person vs virtual (zoom) dinner meetings. Dr LaFalce discussed that MOCDS has a contract with Riverview for in-person dinner meetings and a speakers lined up for In person meetings. Dr Shah mentioned that some of our members may not be comfortable attending in person meetings. Dr Sones discussed that our sponsors may be disappointed as they believe they are sponsoring in person meetings. Suggestions were made to
 - Offer in person meeting
 - Offer Virtual meetings which may disappoint spon-

sors

- Offer members the option to attend the in-person meeting and video tape meeting; recorded meeting could then be made available to members who prefer to not attend in person

- Offer shortened in person meetings – no dinner A decision was made that a survey would be sent to members to aid planning of dinner meetings

- 4. T Sniscak advised that in less than a week obtained approximately 20 RSVP's for the Sept 29th Networking event highlighting member interest 5.Dr M Sones discussed the balances in the MOCDS checking and savings accounts. Dr S Albin discussed the balances in the Vanguard and Fidelity Investment accounts
- 6. Dr J Soliman proposed a motion to change the financial institution of MOCDS from Wells Fargo to TD bank to increase the ease of changing the names of Trustees that have access to the checking and savings accounts. Dr Shah stated that we could not as it was a bylaw change, Dr Soanes countered by stating changing the financial institution of the MOCDS was not a by-law change. The motion to change the bank to TD bank passed unanimously. Dr Albin stated that though he supported the change that in his opinion we would still have difficulty changing the names of the account holders
- 7. Dr LaFalce discussed with Dr Albin completing the required paperwork to add additional trustees to the MOCDS Investment accounts 8. Dr R Hersh discussed he is still in the process of reviewing and updating the MOCDS by laws

Dr. Tarnow Course Synopsis

The treatment planning of complex cases requires the highest level of knowledge and skill of the treating team. It is an orchestration of procedures including proper sequencing and timing that makes the difference. An envisionment of the final case before starting is required to know where the goal of treatment will be directed. This, in conjunction with the patients needs and clinical situation comprise the decision-making process for what is the best treatment for the patient. Problems facing the team such as: Which teeth to save or extract? Should implants be placed immediately or in a delayed protocol? Should multiple implants be placed in the aesthetic zone? When and how to include orthodontics if needed for sight development Should pink ceramic be used or should ridge augmentation be performed? · Should the case be splinted or broken up into separate bridges or individual teeth? · How to provisionalize the case throughout treatment · When to immediate load cases versus do a serial extraction case. These concerns will be addressed in this interdisciplinary approach to our most challenging cases.

Immediate placements of implants into extraction sockets is an exciting treatment alternative for our patients. However, there are many potential short and particularly long term risks which the practitioner must be fully aware of. This presentation will focus on the potential problems and benefits both clinically and biologically when the choice of immediate socket placement is made for single and multiple sites. Upon completion of this presentation participants should be able to - Identify what type of healing takes place against the implant in immediate socket placement - Know how to minimize recession with immediate provisionalization · Know the proper crown contour for immediate provisionals · Know if the gap distance really matters · Know if primary closure should be attempted or should it be left open · Know if membranes should be utilized · Know what type of graft material if any should be utilized · Identify what are the potential short and long term risks involved with immediate placement of implants.

Dr. Nosti Course Synopsis

In this one day event, Dr. John Nosti will address both direct and indirect dentistry for the private practice. Direct restorative dentistry is the corner stone to general and cosmetic dental practices. Understanding modern restorative solutions, their indications and how best to efficiently use these materials is key for long-term predictable clinical success. Performing indirect restorative dentistry can be one of the most profitable and rewarding aspects of care. It can also be one of the most confusing areas of dentistry with the plethora of materials to chose from. Understanding which material is best suited per case and why, as well as the decision to bond versus cement will be covered in detail. Dr. Nosti will complete the day walking you through a cosmetic reconstruction, highlighting the role of occlusion and the process he follows to achieve predictable, long lasting results.
