REPORT OF THE COUNCIL ON DENTAL BENEFIT PROGRAMS

MAY 15, 2019

I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL: The Council on Dental Benefit Programs met on May 15, 2019 at Delta Dental of NJ office in Parsippany, NJ. Dr. Edward Tirpack (Chair) called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. Those members present were: Drs. Yvonne Callas (Bergen); Michelle Weddle (Central); Steven Greenbaum (Central Alternate); George Athansios (Essex); Antoinette Tauk (Middlesex); Matt Safari (Monmouth-Ocean Alternate); Kirti Tolia (Passaic); Kim Goldenbaum (Union); Richard Kahn (Periodontics). Those members absent were: Drs. Scott Dubowsky (Hudson); Sidney Whiteman (Mercer/Medicaid Chair); Todd Sirota (Monmouth-Ocean); Paul Lawyer (Southern); Peter Clemente (Orthodontics); Dr. Mark Vitale (Officer Liaison). Dr. Joan Monaco, Director of Dental Care Programs; Ms. Irene Tafaro, Administrative Assistant for Dental Care Programs. Mr. Art Meisel attended a portion of the meeting. Also in attendance were: Dr. Deolinda Reverendo, Dr. Michael DeLuca and staff from Hamilton Dental, and Dr. Bruce Fine.

II. Facility tour: Dr. Keith Libou led the Council members present on a tour of the Delta Dental of NJ facility. He then met with the Council to emphasize the role of dentists in the Health Care continuum and to answer a few questions from the group.

III. SALUTE TO THE FLAG

IV. APPROVAL OF AGENDA: The agenda was approved with the addition of a tour of the Delta Facility, and a discussion regarding the NJ State Board rules regarding Botox treatment provided by general dentists.

V. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 13, 2019 MEETING: The council approved the minutes of the February 13, 2019 meeting.

VI. LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY ISSUES: Mr. Art Meisel updated the Council with the ongoing issue with the Smile Direct Club. He also updated the group with the status of the Network Leasing Bill, the Latex Glove Ban, and the Lawsuit with Aetna.

VII. DENTAL BENEFIT PLAN ISSUES:

A. CRP Statistics:

Staff provided the council with cumulative statistics for January through April 2019 indicating a total of 18 complaints submitted to NJDA for the year. On a monthly basis since the last meeting, 9 were received in January, 4 in February, 2 in March, 2 in April, and 1 in May. Of that number, NJDA successfully resolved 2, 4 were for data purposes, and 12 are still pending. Of the 12 still pending, 5 are various carrier refund requests. Staff also provided Council with statistics on the number of CRPs opened per component to date.

It was pointed out by the Council that there seems to be less complaints filed YTD this year than in past years. It would be interesting to have YTD comparisons for previous YTD data.

B. Smile Direct Club Update/Partnership: A recent United Health Care Bulletin to members indicates that claims for Smile Direct Club may be submitted directly to UHC. In this bulletin UHC states: "This innovative service not only saves money, it also saves time by helping eliminate the need to go to a dental office for checkups." The Council felt the ignorance expressed in this statement speaks for itself. Council also wants to caution our members that such a direct claim submission could have an effect on remaining benefits for the insured, in particular, the patient may reach their lifetime orthodontic maximum before they actually see a dentist.

C. NADP: Statistics from the National Association of Dental Plans were presented to the Council. Some key points learned from these statistics:

- Stats support push for dental/medical integration by carriers
- Potential use of dentists as screening agents saves carriers up to 102.6 billion dollars/year

- 27 million patients see their dentist and not their physician annually
- Dentist can be "used" to save \$\$ (unless dentists can pay attention and get smart about it!)
- Undiagnosed disease statistics show huge potential for savings if dentists screen and refer.
- One study investigated the use of ICD-10 diagnostic codes when processing dental claims. This continues to be an ongoing national focus. Dentists are cautioned to be more proactive and start looking into understanding and using ICD-10 codes.
- The Council suggested that a link to an ICD-10 "cheat sheet" for dentists be provided to the members, perhaps in a Monday morning E-blast.

D. Expansion of Dental in Medicare Part B: Information was given regarding several groups that are strongly advocating for dental to be included in Medicare Part B. One study proposes that there will be considerable savings to Medicare if periodontal treatment is covered for high risk groups (diabetics, CAD, and CVD).

VIII. OLD BUSINESS: New CDT code proposals.

A. The Council proposed and unanimously passed a motion to form a committee to take suggestions for, formulate, and propose new CDT codes. The committee shall be co-chaired by Dr. Michelle Weddle and Dr. George Athansios. Any NJDA member can contribute to and/or can be a member of this committee.

IX. NEW BUSINESS:

A. AAFE and Botox: Several members expressed how they felt deceived by the advertising provided by the AAFE regarding general dentists being able to administer Botox injections to patients. Current restrictions being enforced by the State Board are not consistent with the information provided by the AAFE to some of our member dentists in New Jersey.

B. The Council unanimously passed a motion requesting that a quarterly email blast be sent to all NJDA members advising them that it is highly recommended that all contracts or agreements from insurance carriers or vendors be sent to Art Meisel for review and interpretation.

X. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

A. Aetna Discount Plan: Besides Aetna it seems there are more and more groups trying to capture the "non-insured" with discount plans. Some newer ones discussed at the meeting were Kleer and Chewsi. It was suggested that a course could be run through NJDA to educate members on how and what to do to start their own in-house plans.

B. Cigna and Eservices: Cigna is strongly pushing Eservices. EFT's appear to be the future, and members are advised to learn what they can at this time. So far, it is not mandatory that dentists participate with EFT's.

C. ADA and CAQH: The ADA and CAQH are pushing hard for doctors to register. We will see where this goes.

D. ADA podcasts: The ADA has produced podcasts titled "Beyond the Mouth" covering all topics other than clinical dentistry. Might be worth a listen.

E. Electronic Health Records: Information was provided regarding a rule proposed by the Trump administration that would force health care providers and plans to provide health records to patients in a standardized electronic form. This rule is currently out for public comment.

XI. ADJOURNMENT: The council adjourned at approximately 12:30 p.m. The next council meeting is scheduled for September 18, 2019.

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Jeffries-Bruno at 7:01 p.m.

We do not have a quorum.

Approval of the minutes from last meeting:

Motion was proposed to approve the minutes from the last meeting May 7, 2019 by Dr. Richard Isaacson, 2nd by Dr. R. Angowski.

President's Report (Dr. Jeffries-Bruno):

I am looking forward to a great year representing M-OCDS, especially in the 150-year celebration of NJDA! What a great year we have ahead of us! Thank you for the support and vote of confidence to lead our component, it is a true honor.

The NJDA held a collaborative workshop in June for new and old component leaders. A BIG Thank You to Elisa Velazquez and Rob McTaggart for attending the meeting with me and helping to represent our component. The meeting was well received by all the components. Good ideas for the upcoming year which should increase communication and hopefully help in our quest to keep existing members and add new ones.

Key Points:

1. Starting Fall - The Monday E-Blast will include a section for the component which can be updated weekly, monthly, however we see fit. Dr. Guerrasio has volunteered to help with this task.
2. Starting Fall - Each component will have a "slide" located on the NJDA home page to highlight whatever they would like. We get this "slide space" for one month. We have April 2020. I think April should work well to promote May's Legislative Night, April's Dinner meeting and the end of the year's dinner dance.
3. NJDA cleared up some of the EBA questions, I think we have a better grasp of the program and what to expect. We will be required to include all EBA's to the Officer visitation in January however, only 6 at max are anticipated to attend. NJDA will inform us in time to prepare our overall sponsorship of this meeting.
4. As part of the "new member package", NJDA is rolling out component specific "flyers" highlighting contact info, programs etc. Rob McTaggart volunteered to put together the information for the flyer - Thank You Rob!
5. The NJDA Web Calendar: This was an issue in the past for us - it is the location on NJDA's website that will list our information and meetings. It will now be self-entry with an online form so I can upload that information directly. I have completed our entries for this year.
6. We discussed the 150-year celebrations, officer visitation meet-

ings and the other sponsored programs the NJDA offers.

7. There will be monthly "zoom" informational webcasts for the components to learn more about some of the tasks we perform and the available programs. They will be live during lunch time on some days (TBD) and then archived for on-demand viewing. The goal is to keep us all on the same page and informed. The first one is August 8th 1pm on the Monday E-Blast inclusions for anyone who would like to register please do so. I will be on the call as well.

Communication between NJDA and the components should really improve with the implementation of these programs.

Our executive board met in July to update and exchange roles and organize some final items for this year. We have the calendar completed and a big thank you to the executive board as well as Dr. Friedman for helping to make sure it all came together. I am currently in the process of obtaining CE and we should be set for the year.

The upcoming NJDA Budget meeting will be held September 25th and I will be attending on our behalf.

Lastly, I am looking forward to an excellent year ahead continuing to work on membership. I'm hopeful in the coming year to continue to progress of increasing membership as Dr. Sniscak did so well this year. Being an associate in a practice myself I would like to reach out to other associates and show them it is possible, and important to be involved.

COUNCILS:

Council on Annual Session (Dr. Andricsak):

The Council had a meeting on June 4th, 2019, conflicting with the PAC meeting so I was unable to attend. Here is the condensed version of the meeting minutes:

Each year our numbers get smaller and smaller. The attendance by component indicated that we continue to see the most engagement from Essex, Middlesex, Monmouth and Tri-County. These component numbers reflect why we're getting away from this conference/expo format. The takeaway from the conference is:

- we need strong component participation. Component marketing and engagement is the only way we can ensure successful program planning.

- the revenue generated from the Conference Pass (\$25.00) is effective. It is important to keep this in mind for future planning. Less people will register unless they actually intend on going. The revenue it generates helps to support the program itself

It was noted that going into 2020, our alliances with component leadership is most important. There was a NJDA/Component Collaborative Workshop on June 12th. Component leaders were invited as well as all trustees and council members. I did not attend this meeting.

The meeting was the launch of future online workshops using Zoom. It is the future of our association, and it will happen either quarterly or monthly. With Zoom you can participate from the comfort of your own office. The NJDA/Component Collaborative Workshop will focus on marketing, doing a better job with the component calendar, forms that are used, programs that we sponsor such as the Bank of America program, Colgate program and Officer Visitations. The programs that NJDA sponsors are packaged programs that are pre-approved by the State Board of Dentistry and there are components that do not take advantage. The workshop will also collaborate on membership and recruitment and unveiling a new slide that we are offering on our website and customizations to our Monday Morning email.

NJDA is celebrating its 150th anniversary in 2020 and the council has been tasked with the planning of five celebratory events: Ribbon Cutting Ceremony, President's Dinner Dance, Jersey

Shore Event, Family Picnic, NJDA Official Anniversary

Celebratory Events were designed to highlight different areas of the state and make them available to different audiences of members.

- One of the ideas to get the word out for all these events is to use the Champions of action and to gather momentum. The focus of this group is to use social media, which Sam, from NJDA, did for a short-lived period of time.

- Sam added that when working with the champions there were some who were very engaged and some that weren't very responsive, and she tried to keep the momentum but toward the end of the goal period the champions responded even less. Sam tried reaching out by asking to post program promotions on their component social media pages and there was little to no engagement.

- The Ribbon cutting event is scheduled for Jan 15, 2020, which is our first board meeting of the year and the official grand opening of the new facility. All are encouraged to attend this special event. Breakfast will be served.

- The NJDA dinner dance will be on June 7, 2020 on a private yacht Atlantica. It is on a Sunday which is unusual for us but we're hoping for a good turnout.

- The Jersey Shore event will be in July focusing on the beach. Options under consideration are the Seaview Golf Resort with shuttles to Atlantic City or Ocean Place in Long Branch. Monmouth-Ocean component input would be valued because this is our area, however, when I made suggestions in the past about this event, it fell on deaf ears. I feel the council is rather set on the Seaview. It wouldn't be my choice because it is not a beach resort.

- The Family Picnic event will take place September 13 and will be held in a Mercer County Park to represent central NJ. It will be a family event and have activities like a softball game, sack races and horseshoe tournament, in addition to the BBQ.

- The official anniversary of NJDA is Oct 25, 1870. Oct 25th falls on a Sunday in 2020. The date has yet to be agreed upon. Suggestions for the event are still being discussed but it is looking like it will be an open house reception with a toast. We will have representatives from our EBA's in attendance.

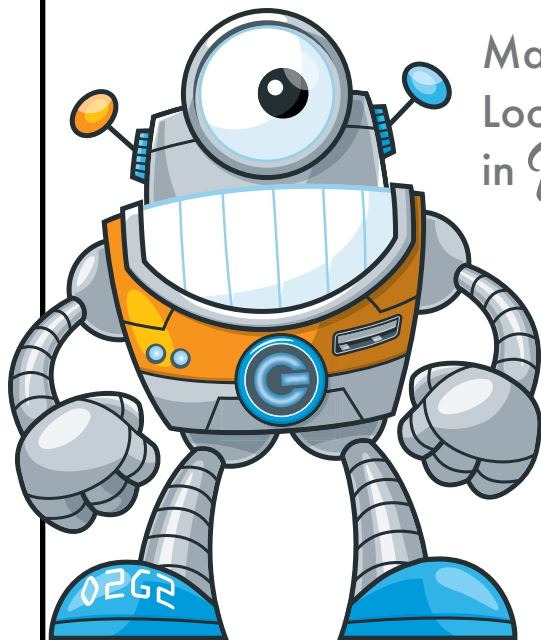
